Delaware Licensing Procedures

The Delaware Insurance Department accepts only electronic license and renewal applications.

Applicants may apply online through the NIPR (National Insurance Producer Registry). The NIPR Gateway is a communication network that electronically links state insurance departments with the entities they regulate. The website address to submit an application is:

CRIMINAL HISTORY REPORTS

State and FBI criminal history information may be obtained from the Delaware State Police. The State Police website is: <u>https://dsp.delaware.gov/obtaining-a-certified-criminal-history/</u>

The service code to receive a criminal history report for a Delaware Insurance License is 27S46Z. The code will request a personal State and FBI criminal history report. You should not use this code unless you are applying for an insurance license.

Delaware State Police will send the criminal history reports directly to our department.

 - o Bail Agent (Bail Agent means a person required to be licensed under the laws of this State to sell, solicit or negotiate contracts of surety bail bond insurance and appointed by a surety insurer that is authorized to transact business in this State to sell, solicit or negotiate contracts of surety bail bond insurance.)
 - Property Bail Agent (Property bail agent means any person, not appointed by a surety insurer, who pledges United States currency, United States postal money orders or cashier's checks or other property as security or surety for a bail bond in connection with a judicial proceeding and receives or is promised therefore money or other things of value.)

BUSINESS ENTITY AGENCY LICENSE

A business entity acting as an insurance producer is required to obtain an insurance producer license. Application may be made online at <u>www.nipr.com</u>

Before approving the application, the Insurance Commissioner shall find that:

- □ The business entity has paid the fees set forth in Title 18 Delaware Code, Chapter 7; and
- The business entity has designated a licensed producer responsible for the business entity's compliance with the insurance laws, rules and regulations of this state.

RENTAL CAR INSURANCE PRODUCER LIMITED LICENSE

Application must be submitted via paper. Click <u>here</u> for the application. The following attachments must be included with the submission:

- 1. List of rental locations.
- 2. Company Training Program that shall include training materials.
- 3. A written statement signed by an officer of the insurer that the insurer will appoint the rental company to act as the agent specifying the kinds of insurance authorized.

VIATICAL SETTLEMENT PROVIDER

Application may be made online at <u>www.nipr.com</u> The license fee is \$275.00. The following attachments must be faxed to 302-736-7906 otherwise the application may be unprocessed or considered deficient.

- 1. Principal Officers List the names, business address and social security number for each officer responsible for the conduct of the registered Viatical Settlement Provider Agents/Brokers.
- 2. List the name, residence address (street number, city, state) and National Producer Number (NPN) for each individual who will transact Viatical Settlements on behalf of the Viatical Settlement Provider's affairs. This individual(s) must be licensed as a Producer in the State of Delaware.
- 3. Provide a business character report for each owner, partner, officer, director, trustee, or member of the applicant or any entity that controls the applicant. "Owner" means an individual with a 10% or greater beneficial ownership. Character reports are available from firms such as Equifax, and Applicant Insight. Regardless of their source, the report must verify employment, education, and military service for the past ten (10) years. Litigation, criminal, UCC, and bankruptcy records must be searched for seven (7) years. At least one business character reference must be obtained for each individual such as an attorney, partner, or other business associate familiar with the business dealings of the individual. Supervisors or co-workers are not acceptable references.
- 4. Attach list of contract forms for filing.

Change of Name

Report any change in name to the Insurance Department within THIRTY (30) DAYS of the change using the <u>2C_form</u>. A check or money order in the amount of \$50.00 payable to Delaware Department of Insurance, proof of name change documents and the 2C form will need to be mailed in for all business entity name changes.

Name changes for Individual Licenses may be submitted electronically with <u>www.nipr.com</u>. Proof of name change will need to be uploaded into the NIPR Attachment Warehouse within 48 hours or transaction is subjected to rejection.
